**EMERGENCY POWERS (COVID 19) (LOCKDOWN) (NO. 3)
(AMENDMENT) ORDER, 2020**

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by the Emergency Powers (Covid 19) Regulations, 2020, **I HEREBY** make the following Order for every island and cay in the Commonwealth of The Bahamas –

1. Citation.

This Order, which amends the Emergency Powers (Covid 19) (Lockdown) (No. 3) Order, 2020, (*S.I. No. 43 of 2020*), may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Covid 19) (Lockdown) (No. 3) (Amendment) Order, 2020.

2. Amendment of order 3 of principal Order.

The principal Order is amended in order 3 –

- (a) by the renumbering of the paragraph as paragraph (1); and
- (b) by the deletion and substitution of paragraph (1)(e) as follows –
 - “(e) landscapers and irrigation personnel shall be permitted to operate on Saturday 18th April, 2020 and Sunday 19th April, 2020 between the hours of 9:00 am and 5:00 pm.”;
- (c) by the insertion immediately after paragraph (1), of the following new paragraph -
 - “(2) Grocery stores shall be permitted to open to the general public on all islands except New Providence and Grand Bahama on Saturday 18th April, 2020 between the hours of 6:00 am and 6:00 pm.”.

3. Amendment of order 5 of the principal Order.

The principal Order is amended in order by the deletion and substitution of order 5 as follows –

“5. Abaco.

Notwithstanding order 2 the following businesses and undertakings in Abaco shall be permitted to operate –

- (a) gas stations on the island of Abaco between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m., for the purpose of refuelling generators;
- (b) non-governmental organisations for the production and provision of water.”.
